Easter Greetings

Jesus Christ is risen!! Alleluia!! Alleluia!!

The joy of our faith echoes out this Easter weekend. Death, sin, discouragement, despair, and evil do not have the final say. The cave that entombs and the stone that seals have been broken open and will never have victory over the God of life! May the reality of Easter give you and your families the strength and joy to face all that comes your way. Thank you for all the ways you make this parish the community of welcome and life that it is.

***Easter**

Easter is the feast of feasts for us Christians. The Word of God, sharing the love of the one we call Father, is spoken by God as a “Yes” out into the freedom of creation. The Word is now able to become—helped by and shaped by the Spirit of God—a free “yes” spoken back to the Father when creation’s energy and matter erupt into living, intelligent, embodied spiritual beings (humanity), who become aware of themselves and of their responsibility to all of life. But it is also a Word that can be freely rejected or distorted by humanity’s “No”. It is a Word active and present in human history, as the Spirit takes all of humanity’s “Yes’s” and “No’s” and brings them together into a special people who know themselves to be the people of God (Israel).

This is a people who, in the fullness of time, bring forth the one who is both the complete “Yes” of God to creation in human form and the full, obedient, Spirit-shaped “Yes” of creation back to God (Jesus). The one, who in obedience to the mission and ministry Abba God has given him, accepts the personal consequences of humanity’s “No”—death on the cross as an innocent victim. But also the one who reveals the definitive, unstoppable “Yes” of the Father’s love as he is raised from the dead. All of that is celebrated this Easter day. The feast of feasts, encompassing Jesus’ life, mission and ministry, suffering and death, and of course his resurrection, ascension and sending of the Spirit to us. All summed up by our proclamation this day: “Jesus Christ is risen! Alleluia! Alleluia!”

***Catholic Services Appeal Reminder**

In early May each household registered in the parish will receive a mailing about this year’s C.S.A. Because we have a number of guests each Easter, I also want to remind you that even those not registered here can make a big difference in the parish’s financial well-being by contributing to this annual appeal. Evangelization Committee Bible Question of the Week

Alleluia! Jesus is alive! Today's Gospel recounts the discovery of Jesus' empty tomb. St. Matthew is more detailed and shares the following: *"After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning,* Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to see the tomb. And behold, there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven, approached, rolled back the stone, and sat upon it. His appearance was like lightning and his clothing was white as snow. The guards were shaken with fear of him and became like dead men. Then the angel said to the women in reply, "Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead.'" The empty tomb is a powerful symbol of Jesus' victory over death and sin! We can rejoice in the knowledge that Jesus has conquered death and paved the way for our resurrection and eternal life. As we move from our Lenten journey and Jesus's Passion and Resurrection, how will you share this amazing news as a disciple of Christ? The angel told them to "go quickly" ♥*
