A Few Thoughts from Fr. Buersmeyer

Mothers' Day

Many of us, myself included, have been blessed with mothers whose love for their children is unquestioned. It simply was and is always present. For example, I had a funeral at another parish for a woman who was a mother of six, grandmother of sixteen and great grandmother of eighteen: a full, rewarding life. She fell in love with and married a very good, hardworking, faithful man at a young age. They wanted a larger family and she was a mom's mom. She had the ability to accept and embrace and love not only each of her children (and they put her to the test over the years!) but also everyone who crossed the threshold of the house. You know the type. The woman others outside the family called "mom" and "grandma" and truly meant it.

Such maternal love is so clearly an expression of God's love for us. We are all meant to experience that embracing, everpresent love, to have it be that creative sea within which we are kept afloat. That is why it is so difficult to believe one is capable of being loved and capable of love if we grow up without that maternal love. At the same time, that is why it is so important, no matter our personal experience with our own mothers, that we have a deep sense of God's maternal love for each of us. To image God in such a way that we are held, embraced, protected, rocked in the loving arms of God who is not only father but mother to us as well.

I think one reason our Catholic devotion to Mary resonates in many people's lives is precisely this maternal imagery. We have tended to image God almost exclusively in male images. And even images that need not be male, we tend to think of them as male—creator, judge, protector, etc. Thankfully, however, we have had a very strong image of Mary as intercessor and protector whose motherly love for her Son (and for us who are Jesus' adopted brothers and sisters) touches a deep chord within us. We know that any devotion to Mary always is meant to strengthen our faith in Jesus Christ. God wants us to experience God's love often in a maternal way. If you are able to image God in that way, I would encourage you to do so in your prayer. But God will also use one's devotion to Mary as a way to show such maternal love through her intercession. If you have moved away from praying the rosary and asking Mary to intercede on your behalf, or have never tried such "Catholic" prayer, May is a good month to try it out. God loves us as deeply as and more deeply than any mother loves her children.

Such divinely-given maternal love in our lives is healing. It is creative and life-bearing. Let us give thanks on this Mothers' Day for all the moms in our life—biological, adopted, spiritual—and pray for them. To know a mother's love, whoever has shown it to us, is to know the blessing of God in our lives.

C.S.A. Reminder

Hopefully all parish households have received their first Catholic Services Appeal reminder from the Archdiocese. Even though it comes from the Archdiocese and supports over 170 ministries of the wider Archdiocese (including a number in our Lower East Side Family of Parishes), this yearly appeal really needs to be seen as a Nativity fund raiser. Our parish's mandatory target is 18,347.00, and we will be billed for every dollar short of that target. On the other hand, we will receive back with no tax taken out every dollar above that target, and no matter how much we raise it will not affect future targets. That is why our contributions to the annual C.S.A. are the most efficient way to donate to the parish. All levels of donations are appreciated and needed, but if you are in a position to give a more significant gift, this is the way that will benefit the parish the most. Thank you.

Evangelization Committee Bible Question of the Week

In today's Gospel, Jesus ascends into heaven, but before he does, he leaves His disciples a mission. He assigns them the task of building up His Church. Jesus says to them: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned. These signs will accompany those who believe: in my name they will drive out demons, they will speak new languages. They will pick up serpents with their hands, and if they drink any deadly thing, it will not harm them. They will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover." After He speaks this, Jesus ascends and takes His seat at the right hand of God. Read those words again, "These signs will accompany those who believe." That means all Christians are to participate in the mission to build up the church (the body of Christ). Do you feel qualified and equipped for the task? Do you recognize the signs of Christ at work today? Is there anything that holds you back from greater surrender to the work of evangelization? If so, you may want to consider that Jesus appointed these same men who just a few weeks earlier had abandoned Him and locked themselves up in a room out of fear. Also look back at the past two week's Gospels.


